"English Review"

A strong story of German army life, "Vin Ordinaire," by Mr. D. H. Lawrence, is the best of the lighter matters in the *English Review*, though another story, "The Stratagem," by Aleister Crowley, is ingeniously and farcically imaginative. Among the verse is a poem, rough but haunting, entitled, "The Children," by Mr. F. G. Layton. Of more serious articles "President Wilson," by Mr. Sydney Brooks; "The Land of London: the Leasehold System," by Mr. W. M. J. Williams; "Democratic Painting and the 'Desophistication of the Eye,' " by Mr. Bernhard Sickert; and "The New Spirit in Portugal," by Lady Muir Mackenzie, are to be noted.
