IN COURT ON CHARGE OF RECEIVING LETTERS

Only evidence of arrest was given at Marylebone yesterday when Edward Alexander Crowley, an author, known as Aleister Crowley, aged 58, of Upper Montagu-street, W., was remanded on bail of £10 for six days charged with feloniously receiving five letters, the property of Betty Sedgwick.

Mr. E. F. Iwi, prosecuting, said the letters were in the custody of the Crown Office, and application would have to be made in the High Court for them to be produced before the magazine.

Mr. I. Kerman, for the defence, said that Crowley had a complete answer to the charge.

Mr. Snell: There is another man connected with the case.

Detective-Sergeant Davidson: So far I have been unable to trace him, but I have hopes of doing so in the very near future.
