



Buddhism has never been truly presented to the American public. Its teachings have either been ignorantly or the fashion of ignorance in general, it has been receiving better treatment.

Under such teachers Mr. Crowley was able not only to analyze the doctrine, but to experience the high ecstatic truths; and his comments will interest all those whose knowledge of the strongest and most magnificent of Oriental religions is derived only from popular or sectarian accounts.
